If you're being bullied:

DO

- Maintain visual contact
- Tell them to go away
- Ignore them
- Walk away
- Remember it's not your fault



DON'T

- Do what they say
- Look upset or cry
- Get angry
- Hit them

What should I do if I see someone else being bullied?

- Don't walk away and ignore the bullying!
- Let the bully know what's happening.
- Tell the bully to S.T.O.P
- Don't stay silent or the bullying will keep happening.
- Tell a member of staff
